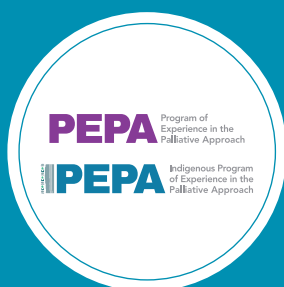

Ken Hillman AO FRCP FRCA FCICM is an Australian doctor and researcher. He is an intensive care specialist with research interests including health system reforms and end of life care. As a world leader in managing the care of very sick people, Ken Hillman's breakthrough methods of treating critically ill patients have become the gold standard in Australia, the U.S. and Europe.
